claw	A curved pointed horny nail on each digit of the foot in birds, lizards, and some mammals.
feathers	Any of the flat appendages growing from a bird's skin and forming its plumage.
beak	A bird's horny, projecting jaws; a bill.
taste	The sensation of flavour perceived in the mouth and throat on contact with a substance
fingers	Each of the four slender, jointed parts attached to either hand (or five, if the thumb is included).
