

RE Knowledge organiser:**Year 1: How do you belong to Hinduism?****YEAR GROUP BIG QUESTION: What does it mean to belong?****Vocabulary**

Murti: Hindu god or goddess statue

Reincarnation: A belief that a person has more than more life on earth

Karma: A belief that good actions lead to more goodness in your life, and your bad actions lead to more problems in your life

Puja: Prayer actions and words

Brahman: The most important god for Hindu people

Krishna: a Hindu god

Dharma: Following the teaching of Hindu scriptures and teachers

Offerings: During worship at home or at the temple Hindu people often give rice, milk, flowers or money to the murti's of the gods or goddesses – as a way of showing their love

Vedas: A collection of Hindu sacred texts that Hindu people will learn in order to understand how to live well in the world today
