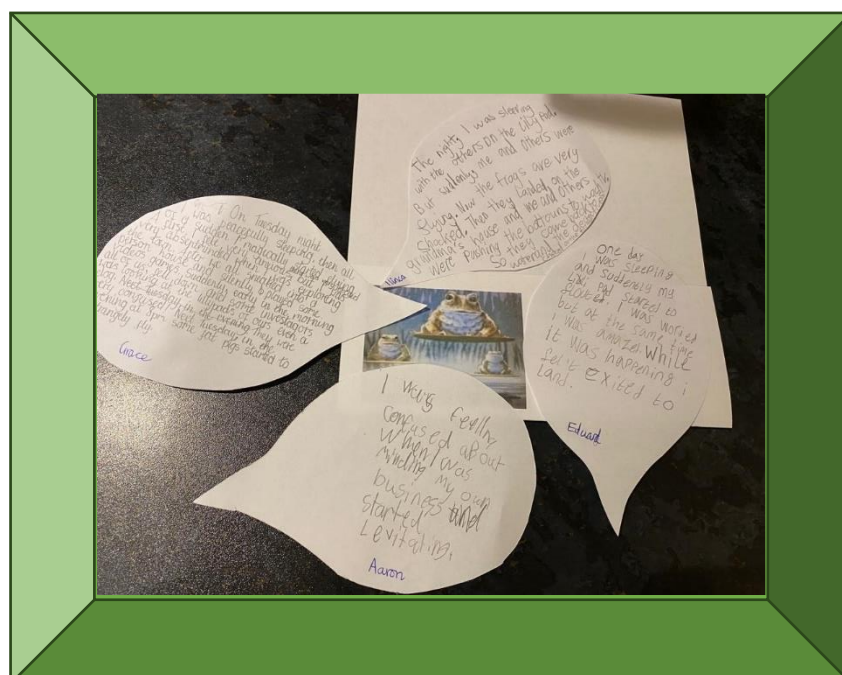

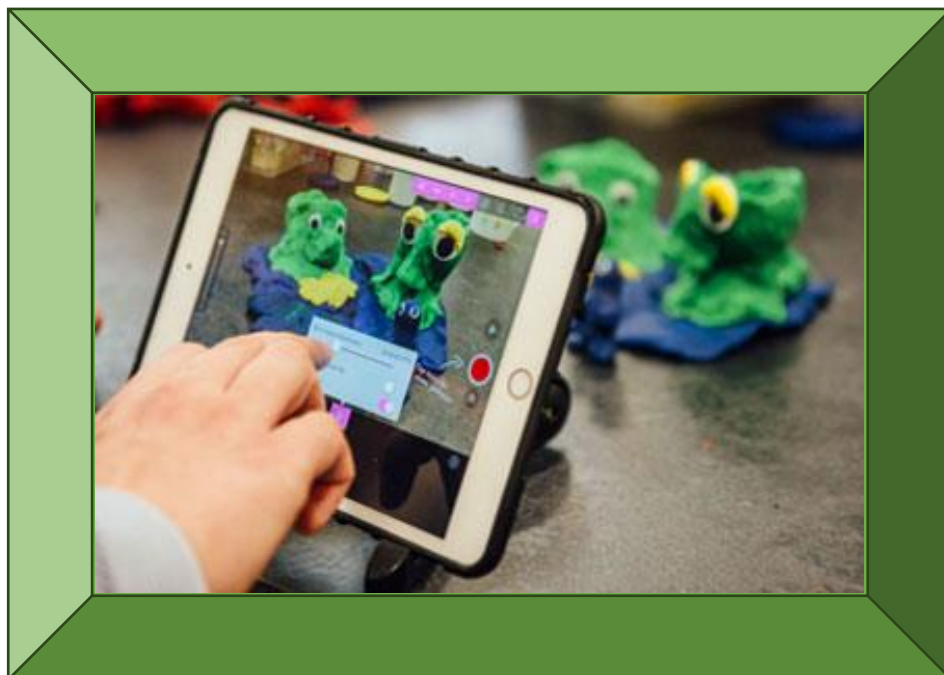

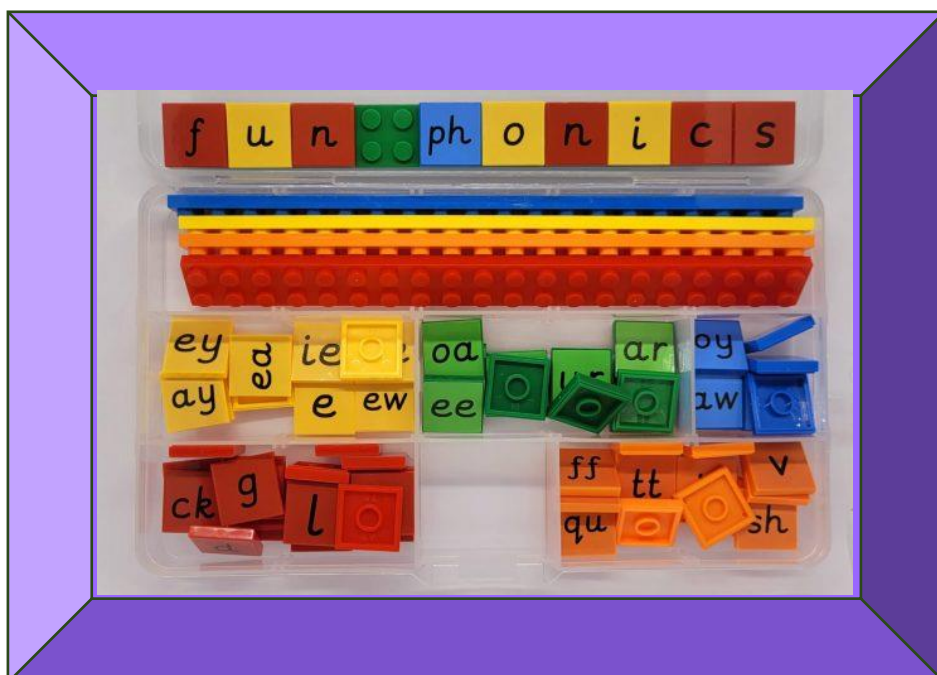

Dancers will wear vibrant, colourful costumes while they are performing. This special dance costume is known as the vardi.

Dancers perform to Bhangra music where you will hear tradition Punjabi instruments. Sometimes, there are singers accompanying the dancers, too. The singers usually sing in Punjabi, with lyrics about positive, upbeat topics to match the joyous energy of the dance.
