School Uniform Reminders- Get Prepared for September!

School Uniform is compulsory for all pupils at Marsh Green. We have pride in our school, and ourselves and wearing school uniform is one important way in which we demonstrate this. During the past year, we have been considerate of family circumstances and any difficulties in obtaining uniform. **We can offer support where needed and we also offer a uniform shop where items are priced very cheaply at £2 per item.**

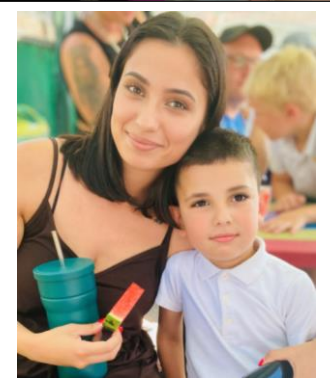

Guinness World Record!

A group of Year 6 children took part in a Guinness World Record on Tuesday 1st July with Jamie Oliver and we won! They cooked pasta from scratch and were able to eat the food afterwards. They learnt a range of culinary skills that they can transpire into the future!



The record attempt was carried out to illustrate Jamie's core belief that all children, everywhere, should be able to leave education at 16 with the ability to cook and provide for themselves – no matter what life throws at them. From nutritional knowledge, knife skills, food safety to budgeting.



Young Marketeers Project



Young marketeers raise over £500 at Barking Market

Children from nine local schools brought their school-grown fruit and vegetables to Barking Market for a special event celebrating food education and community giving.

The event was the culmination of six months of hard work as part of the Young Marketeers programme, a food education initiative run by School Food Matters.

During the scheme students learned about food systems, sustainability, and the impact of food waste — all while cultivating their own produce in school gardens.

Councillor Syed Ghani, Cabinet Member for Enforcement and Community Safety said: "This event was a fantastic example of how education, community, and sustainability can come together to empower young people. The enthusiasm and dedication shown by the students was truly inspiring."

The children proudly sold their harvest to the public, creating a vibrant atmosphere and raising over £500. All proceeds will go towards tackling food insecurity through Plan Zheroes and supporting further food education initiatives.

The children in Year 5 and 6 have been fully immersed in the project and have understood and developed the appreciation for grown produce. They have learnt how to look after plants as well as understanding the process of their life cycle. The children have harvested and sold the produce grown at Barking Market on the 4th July and used their marketeer skills to raise money for our school and Plan Zheroes. The children were fantastic and negotiated with customers to generate sales. They raised £40, which is amazing!
